

New pdfDocs release: an integrated solution that “cleans” up

Sydney, Australia – 24 May, 2006 – DocsCorp (www.docscorp.com), the developer of the pdfDocs document processing and exchange software, announced the release of pdfDocs Desktop 1.8 and pdfDocs OCR 1.1 today.

Designed to help organizations exchange business-critical documents in a format that is safe, secure and universal, the latest versions of pdfDocs Desktop and OCR provide even better integration with MS Office applications, document management systems, multi functioning devices (MFDs) and scanners giving organizations better access to information, enhancing business processes and systems, increasing productivity and securing documents distributed outside the company firewall.

According to Dean Sappey, DocsCorp CEO, the latest releases deliver substantial benefits to users in terms of flexibility, speed and ease of use. MS Office users can now simply drag and drop documents directly onto the pdfDocs icon or pdfDocs Organizer to convert them to PDF. Documents can then be combined with other documents, annotated or redacted in the pdfDocs Organizer. The final document can then be saved directly into a document management system, optimized for the web or emailed directly to clients.

With pdfDocs Desktop 1.8 distributing electronic documents outside the enterprise security perimeter is no longer fraught with danger. pdfDocs Desktop 1.8 can be configured to automatically convert email attachments to PDF. Setting up an enterprise-wide secure email policy with pdfDocs Desktop ensures that emailed documents are “clean” and that they represent little or no risk to the business. Sappey thinks that this capability will be particularly appealing to companies of all sizes as it gives them enhanced email security and it’s one less product they have to purchase from another vendor.

"Clean" PDF documents have all the metadata from the original document stripped out and the document locked down so that it cannot be changed or modified in any way. Making this an automatic process removes the possibility of staff unintentionally releasing embarrassing information.

The user interface in pdfDocs Desktop 1.8 has been enhanced to give users easier and faster access to those features they use most frequently. The editor view has also undergone significant changes as users can now electronically mark-up the PDF document with sticky notes, highlight text, insert form fields and apply multiple stationery sets to the PDF document.

pdfDocs OCR 1.1 continues to deliver critical business information locked away in paper documents and scanned images to individual pdfDocs Desktop users. pdfDocs OCR converts paper documents and scanned images into searchable PDF documents or into Word or rich text format documents. Version 1.1 delivers even more accurate conversion to PDF and to Word, document formatting truer to the original and even more languages supported.
